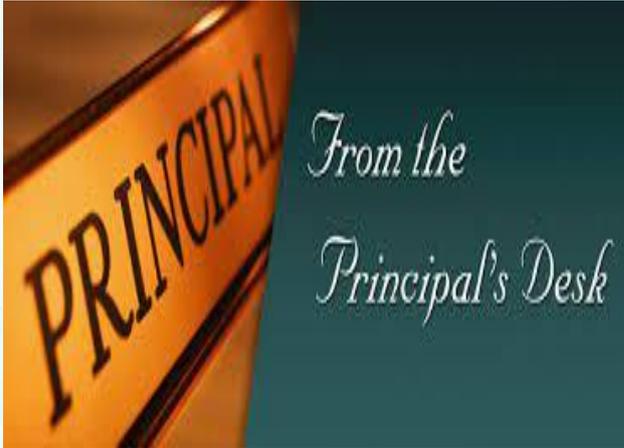





13. Expert Talk on Artificial Intelligence




community across the country. He travelled across the country with his Ladeniya Troup to serve especially the forest dwellers and nomadic tribes. Due to his extraordinary knowledge, excellent skills and spiritual background in Ayurveda and Naturopathy, he was able to dispel and eradicate myths and superstitions prevalent in the tribal communities and brought about reforms in their way of life. Among such communities, the Banjara community settled across the country with different names, have permanently abandoned their nomadic lifestyle and settled in their settlements called Tandas. 23. Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Jayanti



The institute celebrated Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Jayanti commemorating the 394th birth anniversary of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, one of the greatest warriors in Indian history on 19th February, 2025. He was popularly known as Shivaji

Bhonsle, a member of the Bhonsle Maratha clan. He promoted the use of Marathi and Sanskrit in court and administration, in times when the norms were to use Persian language. Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj is known and

celebrated for his valour and flawless strategies for battlefield. He won several wars against the Mughals and flared victory of the Marathas on the Indian land. Talented and intelligent since childhood, Jambhekar became a great scholar and researcher in many subjects on adulthood. He was active only for a very short period, but his exceptional work left a permanent mark on India. Balshastri Jambhekar had grasped correctly the importance and power of the print media in the coming times during British Rule in India. He was sure that if the British were to be overthrown and

freedom was to be attained, then it was essential to awaken the masses and the print media was the most useful tool to that end. The newspaper Darpan was born out of this patriotism and social awareness. He founded Darpan as the first Marathinewspaper. He was editor of this newspaper during the British rule in India. This turned out to be the beginning of Marathi journalism.




38. Expert Lecture on PCB Manufacturing Process – MU Dept



Ratan Tata received his early education in Mumbai and later attended the prestigious Cathedral and John Connon School. He then went on to study at the Cornell University in New York, where he earned a degree in Architecture and Structural Engineering. He also completed an Advanced Management Program at Harvard Business School.

Throughout his life, Ratan Tata has been committed to giving back to society and has been involved in various philanthropic efforts through the Tata Trusts. He has been a strong advocate for various causes, including education, healthcare, and the empowerment of women, and has supported numerous non-profit organizations working in these areas.





His efforts to revive the loss-making airline reflect a dedication to rebuilding India's aviation industry, which originally began as Tata Airlines before becoming Air India.


